

World War I



A war fought from 1914 to 1918, mostly in Europe and the Middle East, between the Allies and the Central Powers

Allies



The nations that united against the Central Powers of Europe. The Allied countries included Great Britain, France, Russia, Italy and the United States.

Central Powers



The nations that fought against the Allies. They included Germany, Austria-Hungary, the Ottoman Empire and Bulgaria.

War effort



The combined efforts of those at home as well as those in the military to win a war

Propaganda



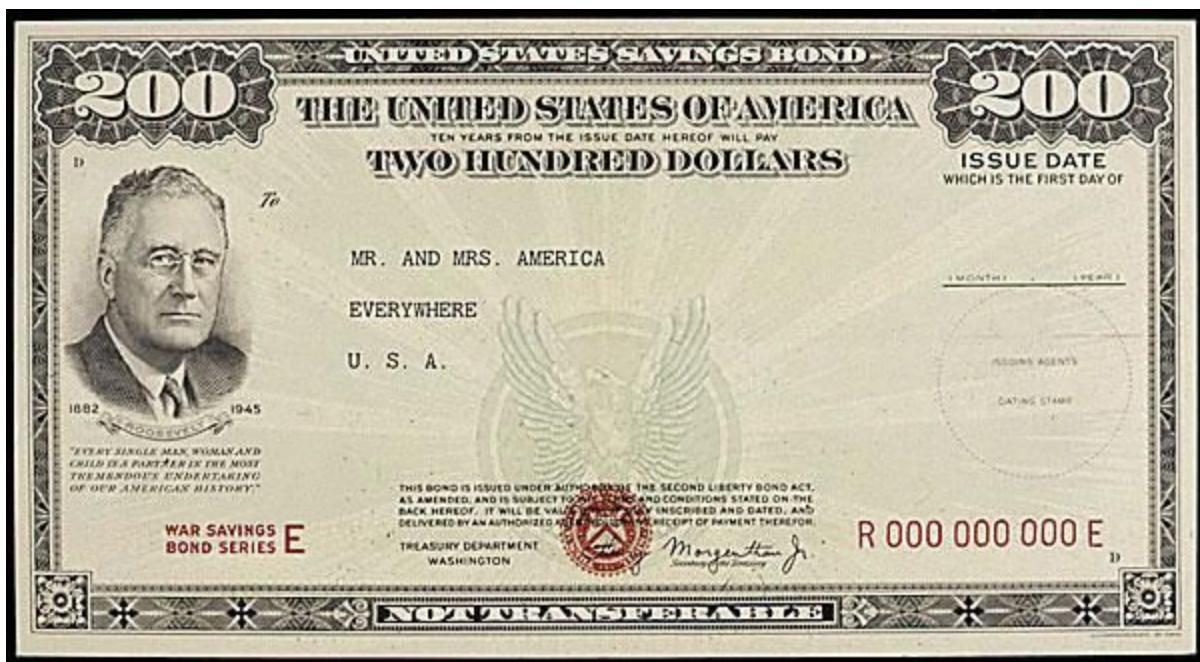
The organized spreading of information in order to persuade people to adopt a certain position. It typically only presents one point of view.

Patriotism



Loyalty to one's country

War bond (liberty bond)



A certificate sold to citizens by a government in order to help pay for a war.

Commission of Public Safety (CPS)



A state agency that existed only during WWI. Its role was to oversee the war effort in MN.

Trench warfare



is a form of land warfare using occupied fighting lines consisting largely of trenches, in which troops are significantly protected from the enemy's small arms fire and are mainly sheltered from artillery.
